

Died.

On Wednesday, August 16th, 1893, at her home in Grand valley, Ida, the beloved wife of Mr. E. M. Slocomb, of scarlet fever.

Mrs. Slocomb visited Grand Junction last Thursday with Mrs. W. P. Slocomb, and it is supposed that she was exposed to the disease while here. On Sunday, herself, with six out of seven of her children, were down with the fever, and on Tuesday Mrs. Slocomb's symptoms changed for the worse and she died Wednesday morning. The children are still very sick, but it is hoped all danger is passed.

Mr. Slocomb has the sympathies of the community in his bereavement and the affliction which has come upon him and his family. Mrs. Slocomb's funeral occured Thursday from the Ross school house.

LATER:—One of Mr. Slocomb's little boys died on Thursday and was buried on Friday morning. As we go to press another one is reported very low and it is expected will die before morning.
