

GIVES UP ITS DEAD.

Body of the Drowned Indian Boy Discovered This Morning.

This morning, about 6:30 o'clock, G.W. Jackson, who resides on Orchard mess, discovered the body of a man on the dike built into the Grand river to throw water into the head race of the Cox pumping plant.

He immediately communicated the fact to Dr. F. R. Smith, county coroner, who, in company with Undertaker H. C. Bucklin and Expressman Bob Thomas, immediately repaired to the place where the body was discovered.

From the appearance of the body Dr. Smith is of the opinion that it had been in the water about five days.

The body was brought to the city at once, and C. E. Schooley, one of the instructors at Teller institute, and David Montesa, a Ute boy, recognized it by the clothes as that of Milfred Cleveland, the Navajo boy lost from a camping party last Friday, en route home from Leon creek. The features were unrecognizable on account of the length of time the body had been in the water.
