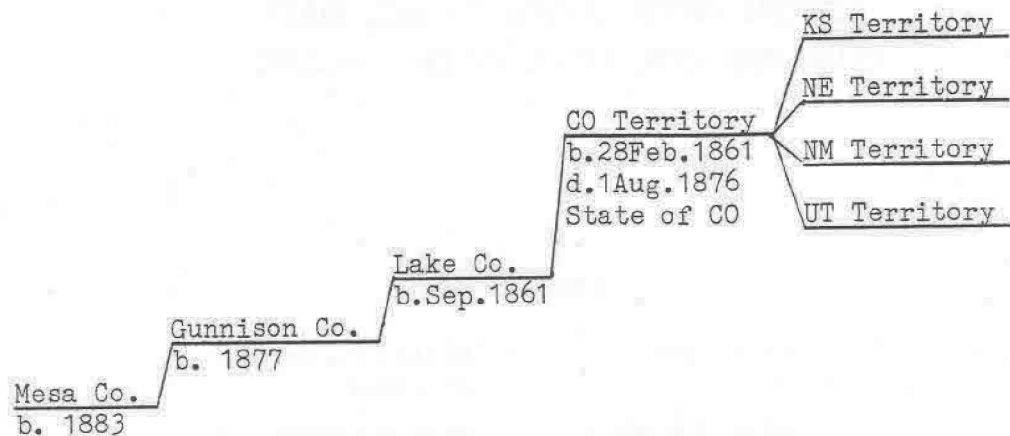

\*\*\*\*SOCIETY NEWS\*\*\*\*

These were accepted as presented with the assurance that if changes became necessary in the future, they could be made by following a By-Laws provision. The Board of Directors will meet on a regular schedule in the future. The second Tuesday after the general meeting is the chosen date.

There was some question over Article 7, Sec. B, No. 2 of the By-Laws and it was decided that Terry Coulson would rewrite this part of the By-Laws and present it at the June meeting. There was also an unanimous vote that #12 be taken off the Standing Rules. At the June meeting, Terry Coulson presented the rewritten By-Law and it was voted on and approved to read as follows:

Article 7, Sec. B, No. 2: In case of a vacancy of any office, other than the president, the president shall appoint a replacement for the remainder of the term.

\*\*\*\*NATIONAL ARCHIVES FUND\*\*\*\*

Genealogists everywhere are being asked to contribute one dollar (\$1) (or more) to an Archives Gift Fund. There have been such drastic cuts in funds from the Federal Budget to the National Archives for servicing the many requests from genealogists for information that a special National Archives Fund has been created to assist in this work.

The Fund is sponsored by The Federation of Genealogical Societies, of which Colorado Genealogical Society is a member. It will be used for Finding Aids in genealogy at the National Archives for which there can be no government funding. When sufficient funds have been accumulated for a specific Finding Air, a check will be sent to the National Archives Gift Fund in the amount to cover that project. The genealogical community will be notified when the Aid becomes available.

The specific Finding Aid will be selected by The Genealogical Coordinating Committee in consultation with the staff of the National Archives. The Committee is composed of representatives of the American Society of Genealogist, the Association of Professional Genealogists, the Board for Certification of Genealogists, the Federation of Genealogical Societies, the Genealogical Society of Utah and the National Genealogical Society.

Finding Air projects under consideration now are:

1. Complete pension files for the Revolution and War of 1812.
2. Complete index to Passport Applications and microfilming it.
3. Microfilming Civil War Records. (Service and volunteer records)

\*\*\*\*100 YEARS\*\*\*\*

Several churches in Mesa County are celebrating being 100 years old in 1983. The First Baptist Church at 720 Grand Ave., Grand Junction, Colorado, was one church that celebrated it's 100th year.

As reported by Kathleen McMullen, Sentinel Staff Writer for the Daily Sentinel, "The first church was built in 1883 by 15 charter members at the present Mesa County Public Library site. Church membership grew, and in 1909 new lots were purchased at Seventh and Grand Ave. and construction for a new building began. The foundation was laid for the church in 1910, but war pressures and fruit crop failure made it impossible for the building to be completed until 10 years later, according to church records." Of the 15 charter members who built the first church, the First Baptist Church was able to furnish us with 12 of their names:

\*\*\*\*WERE YOUR ANCESTORS AMONG THESE\*\*\*\*

The Declaration of Independence was adopted by the Continental Congress on 4 July, 1776. It was prepared by a committee consisting of Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Robert R. Livingston and Roger Sherman in response to a resolution offered to the Congress on 7 June, 1776 by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia.

Most delegates signed the Declaration August 2, but George Wythe (Va), signed August 27; Richard Henry Lee (Va), Elbridge Gerry (Mass) and Oliver Wolcott (Conn) in September; Matthew Thornton (N.H.), not a delegate until September, in November; and Thomas McKean (Del.), although present on July 4, not until 1781 by special permission, having served in the army in the interim.

The 56 signers from our 13 Colonies were:

New Hampshire: Josiah BARTLETT, William WHIPPLE, Matthew THORNTON.

Rhode Island: Stephen HOPKINS, William ELLERY.

Connecticut: Roger SHERMAN, Samuel HUNTINGTON, William WILLIAMS, Oliver WOLCOTT.

New York: William FLOYD, Phillip LIVINGSTON, Francis LEWIS, Lewis MORRIS.

New Jersey: Richard STOCKTON, Jno. WITHERSPOON, Francis HOPKINSON, John HART, Abraham CLARK.

Pennsylvania: Robert MORRIS, Benjamin RUSH, Benjamin FRANKLIN, John MORTON, George CLYMER, James SMITH, George TAYLOR, James WILSON, George ROSS.

Delaware: Caesar RODNEY, George READ, Thomas MCKEAN.

Maryland: Samuel CHASE, William PACA, Thomas STONE, Charles CARROLL of Carrollton.
