

*** PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE ***

Our Society has two constant sources of help when clues are needed in seeking an answer to "one-of-those-questions", Mesa County Public Library and the Museum of Western Colorado. We are in the unique position of being able to contribute a great deal toward improving the quality and quantity of genealogical and historical materials to both of these facilities.

I would urge each of us to seek help from these two resources and not be discouraged if often it is not there for us. Genealogical research in our area has only gained its momentum in the past five years and we help these facilities to know what we need by asking for it. They don't know our needs until we can make it known. Their responses to increased requests cannot be instantaneous but can be forth-coming with our help and support.

Both the Library and the Museum are responding to genealogical requests in very positive ways. The Library co-sponsored with us a seminar in August and are making it possible for the genelogical specialist from Denver Public Library to come to Grand Junction in October. More research materials are being added for genealogy and the Conference Room and Kiva Room are available to us on request.

The Museum, under new director Mike Perry, is continuing the projected increase in space and services. On Nov. 8th he will bring to our general meeting a slide presentation about Mesa County and we will have an opportunity to discuss our needs with him.

I hope we can continue our support and help to these facilities with the aim of increasing their capacities for genealogical research. Billie Richardson

SEMINAR SPEAKER **RON BREMER SSSSSS

Mesa County Public Library and the Genealogical Society were hosts at a seminar held on August 18th at Mesa Mall. Guest Speaker was Ronald A. Bremer of Salt Lake City, a professional genealogist and author of several genealogical publications. Mr. George Van Camp and Mrs. Terry Pickens of the Library gave brief welcoming

addresses to the group.

Out of town guests included 3 from Clifton, 2 from Fruita, 1 from Palisade, I from Grand Valley, 6 from Rifle, 1 from Eagle, 1 from Gypsum and 1 from Sun City Arizona.

There was no charge for the seminar, but donations to the Society were accepted. Funds remaining after expenses were paid were applied toward the purchase of Mr. Bremer's new book The Compendium of Historical Sources. Fifty-two dollars in book fund contributions are still needed to complete payment for this reference book.


AAAA TIPS AAAA

LITTLE PARK SCHOOL was one of the many one-room log structures that filled the need for school buildings in rural areas all across our country. This one was built for a community of homesteaders about eight miles southwest of Grand Junction on Little Park Road.

It was built by Henry S. LANE with the help of neighboring homesteaders, probably in 1914, and it is believed that its first school year was 1914-been unable to find out how much longer it was used.

Serving on the school board at that time were Henry S. LANE, A. N. FERGUSON and Frank THOMPSON. Three of the remembered teachers were Miss ROBBINS, Florence GOODALL and Georgia PARKER (in the picture).

च्यस्य SUPPORT SOUGHT FOR MESA COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY स्वस्यस

Our public Library is supported entirely by funds generated in Mesa County. The present mill levy, allowed by law, of 1.5 miles provides the budget each year for the

Library. It has been inadequate for a number of years.

The County Commissioners were able to supplement this Insufficiency by using some sales tax revenues and other funds available for such purposes until recently. As the economics of our County weakened, county sales tax revenues lessened, supplemental

funds for the Library were no longer available.

To give the best service possible with the funds provided, the Library has been forced to make cut-backs. They have had to close the door for 14 hours of service that we are used to having. They cut back on purchases of books and periodicals that they would like to provide for us. The branch libraries at Fruita, Clifton, Palisade, DeBeque, Collbran and the Bookmobile stops have also felt the effects of the shortage of funds.

Uniquely, a library receives more requests for service in a time of economic

depression than when times are good.

The County Library Board of Directors is asking the voters of Mesa County to Consider increasing the mill levy ceiling from 1.5 to 2.5 mills. The average homeowner's taxes would increase by a little less than two cents per day, about \$7 per year.

The increased budget would allow the main Library to be open for 61 hours per week instead of the present 48. It would provide the opportunity for expanded services

at the branch libraries and increase the book budget by 50 percent.
