

#### PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

So you are planning a genealogical research trip -- well, don't leave in too much of a hurry. Doing your homework before you leave may save you time and money. Do as much of your research as possible right at home, using local libraries and their services including microfilm ordering and inter-library loans.

Once you have decided that you will need to make a trip, find out what records are available in the area where your ancestors lived. Write to these repositories to find out the procedures required to use them. Find out the location, days and hours they are open, what holidays are observed, requirements of advanced notice to see certain records, charges for access to records and whether copy machines are available or a copy service is available.

In the case of libraries, museums or archives, write in advance for printed inventories or guides to their holdings. This may help you decide what materials you want to see. Sending an advance letter to the librarian or archivist stating the records you want to see may expedite your research.

Don't forget to take along plenty of family group sheets, research calendar sheets, extract sheets, pencils and a clipboard. If you get a chance to interview someone, have a tape recorder along. If you plan to visit a cemetary, have some grass clippers, a flashlight, a camera and gravestone rubbing materials with you.

All of this advanced preparation will make for a smoother, more efficient research trip. Keep in mind that a thank you note to the librarian, archivist or records custodian who helped you will be greatly appreciated and may also aid future research trips by you or other researchers. A small donation to a church or museum that you have visited can also show your appreciation for their help.

You may be interested in writing for the following two research trip aids:

- 1. If you are doing pre-1820 research, you can order THE EARLY AMERICAN HISTORIANS TRAVEL GUIDE from the Institute of Early American History and Culture, Box 220, Williamsburg, VA 23187. This guide will give you important information on major repositories around the country, but more specifically, those located in the original 13 states.
- Join <u>VISITING FRIENDS</u> for a \$15.00 lifetime fee. This membership will allow you to stay in a private home (for a small fee) while you are researching at State Archives, County Courthouses, etc. Write to Visiting Friends, Inc., Box 231, Lake Jackson, TX 77566



committees for 1986.




A SPECIAL FRIEND

Members are asked to submit five surname cards when they join and are encouraged to file as many more as they wish. The file is available for checking at The Ancestor Shop, 15th and North Complex, located on the corner of 15th Street and North Avenue. Members may have the file checked by mail by sending requests to Mesa County Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 1506, Grand Junction, CO., 81502 and a self-addressed stamped envelope. Non-members may have the file checked for \$1.00 per surname and SASE. If no information is found, your money will be returned. Information the genealogist believes is yours will be copied and sent to you.

Cards may be purchased at The Ancestor Shop, at general meetings or may be ordered by mail in packets of 10 @ .25¢ + .22¢ postage, 25 cards @ .50¢ + .39¢, 50 cards @ \$1.00 + .73¢ and 100 cards @ \$1.75 + .98¢ postage.

We are scarcely started in genealogy before a monster rears up and challenges us to number the ancestor charts. Imogene Wiley and Dana Zamora have taken the time to work up numbering guides for 4 and 5 generation ancestor charts. We are demonstrating a short example for each chart.

FOUR GENERATION CHARTS: On Chart No. 1, begin numbering your continuations with 2 for No. 8 Ancestor, 3 for no. 9 Ancestor and down to the bottom of the page in numerical order.

On Chart No. 2, begin numbering your continuations with  $\underline{10}$  for No. 8 Ancestor and follow to the bottom of the page in numerical order. The guide for Four Generation Charts has been prepared to include chart 144 which will include Ancestor No. 1153.

FIVE GENERATION CHARTS: The guide works the same way for five generation charts but we have more ancestors on the page. Ancestor No. 16 will be continued on Chart No. 2, No. 17 on Chart No. 3 and on down to the bottom of Chart 1 in numerical order.

On Chart No. 2, begin numbering your continuations with No. 18 for Ancestor No. 16 and to the bottom of the page in numerical order. The guide is prepared to include Chart No. 108.

### DOZEDOZEDO EDGAR L. WARNER DIES AT AGE 67 DOZEDOZEDOZEDO

We are saddened by the death of member Edgar Loring Warner who died Thursday, Ocotber 3, 1985, at his home after a lengthy illness. He had been a resident of Grand Junction since 1979 and a member of Mesa County Genealogical Society since 1980.

He was born November 22, 1917, at Fostoria, Ohio and spent his child-hood in Fostoria and Cleveland. In 1935 he graduated from Fostoria High School and later attended Fenn College and Michigan State University in East Lansing.

On September 2, 1939, he married N. Madge Smith in Covington, Kentucky, who survives.

Mr Warner was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and had a strong interest in genealogy. He belonged to the First families of Ohio, Ohio Genealogical Society, Mesa County Genealogical Society and the Sanborn Family Association. He was a 32nd degree Mason and member of the Oliver H. Perry Masonic Lodge No. 341 in Port Clinton, Ohio and the Scottish Rite of Toledo, Ohio. He was also a member of the Museum of Western Colorado and a master gunman.

His advice and suggestions to the Society in our formative years was often sought. He was especially helpful in developing our By-Laws and in sharing his knowledge and expertise in genealogical research in Ohio and Pennsylvania.

Our sympathy is extended to his wife Madge, who is also a member of the Society. We share her loss.

## colorologo Fistful of Firsts colorologo

The research of member Pat Allen has left us with boxes and boxes of references on 3 x 5 cards that has inspired this series for the Quarterly. We have pulled some of her cards, added enough others to make a fistful, and put them in chronological order - all FIRSTS in Grand Junction.

#### 1881

- Oct 31 The first Hallowe'en in Grand Junction revealed a grandiose trick that was the real thing. When Mr. Crawford returned to Grand Juncfrom Gunnison, where he had gone with others to prepare and file the legal documents for the new town, he found "claim jumpers" had claimed all but two 40-acre plots in Section 14, the site chosen for his new Grand Junction. John Allen, representing Mershon and Majors, had pitched a tent in the middle of Section 14, was digging a well there and called the new town West Denver.
- Nov 5 Petition for the <u>first post office</u> was signed by the settlers requesting a postal route and service at Grand Junction. The influence of
- the "jumpers" (Majors brothers) and the Postal Department's opposition to compound names, caused the name of Grand Junction to be denied and UTE was the name assigned to the new service.
- Nov 9 First day cold enough to wear a coat in Grand Junction. "Danney" Mickey, an old settler of 20 or 30 days, declared that "this is the first day this season" that he has worn a coat Italian climate.
- Nov 16 The first snow on the new town "vanishes like frost in 2 hours".
- Nov 21 First Express service. F. Bascom Wilson, from Roubidoux arranges to run an Express to Cantonment (70 miles away) and carry mail. Town without mail heretofore.
- Nov 26 First boards in Grand Junction. Mr. Crawford gets three small boards from William Inness, recently from Pitkin and now Sheriff of Mesa County, as a special favor to make a cupboard. Until Inness came there was not a board nearer than Cantonment.
- Nov 28 First well was begun by George P. Bates and Van de Venter for the Town Company at the SE corner of Block 121.
- Dec 8 First lady to live in Grand Junction was the wife of Judge Mobley who brought her to G.J. with him when he returned from Gunnison.
- Dec 11 First store in town. H. P. Gile, packer for Capt. Irwin's survey party, returned from Gunnison and rented Judge Mobley's building on Colorado Avenue for a store at \$10 per month. His partner was C. F. Mitchell.
- Dec 17 First lot taken on Main Street was a gift to William Reber, Lot 5, Block 121.
- Dec 25 First Christmas was celebrated with horse racing in town. The weather was so warm that "old man Gordon" and John were in their shirt sleeves.

The first two years for Grand Junction, 1881-1882, had a <u>first</u> in every day events, most of them not very earth-shattering. We will continue these items from time to time. If you know a <u>first</u> in Grand Junction or Mesa County send it to us at Box 1506, Zip 81502, and it will find its place in our Quarterly.
