


WE ARE STUMPED

The Society receives requests occasionally for assistance in family research in Mesa County. Most often we are able to answer these queries, but there are a few "stumpers" left over from 1985. Perhaps you can help us with answers to this one.

Mr. Bert ABRAHMS of Leicester, North Carolina is seeking information about his grandmother Harriet Roberson McCracken, married to George McCracken, children John, Herman, Forrest and Lillie. Harriet is believed to have died in 1886 and buried here. Mr. McCracken returned to North Carolina. Margaret WHITLEY of Grand Junction wrote to him in 1916 telling him news of friends and neighbors. She is believed to have taken care of Harriet's grave.

In our files there is a picture of the McCracken family and of Harriet's grave, plus the letter from Margaret WHITLEY. We find no death or burial record - no tracks at all of the McCrackens. Names mentioned in the letter are Thad DUCKET whose daughter married a man named CORN, the GREENS, Hayden and Sallie, Mary MUNROE and Fred G. HOLMES.

CEMETERY RECORDS ON COMPUTER

The Board has accepted a proposal from Gene and Phyllis George to put the Mesa County cemetery records on computer at The Ancestor Shop. The work will be done by volunteers from the Genealogical Society. When completed a research check will yield a variety of information. Some examples are (1) the name, date of death and cemetery of a single individual, (2) a list of all persons of one surname buried in Mesa County cemeteries, (3) all the burials in one cemetery, (4) all the burials on one date.

Our file of cemetery cards will be permanently housed at the Museum of Western Colorado. The Society's computer file will be available for research at The Ancestor Shop and a second copy will be permanently on hand there.

We need volunteers for this project. If you can type and have an hour or two now and then, please call Gene or Phyllis at [REDACTED]. Gene assures us that anyone who types can learn to use the computer very quickly.

"SHAKING YOUR FAMILY TREE"

The first nationally syndicated column on genealogy in the United States was started in 1983 by Myra Vanderpool Gormley, 8402 57th Street West, Tacoma, WA 98467. It is now distributed by the Los Angeles Times Syndicate and is available to daily and weekly U.S. and Canadian newspapers. Mrs. Gormley tries "to entertain, enlighten, encourage and answer research questions..." and tries to keep readers informed about consumer "rip-offs" and to direct them to publications, societies and sources.

LDS GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY MOVES

The Grand Junction Branch Genealogical Library formerly located at 740 Gunnison Avenue has been moved to the Stake building at 547 Melody Lane. Regular hours are scheduled for Mondays from noon to 6 p.m., on Tuesdays through Thursdays from noon to 9 p.m. and Fridays from 3 to 9 p.m. It is located two blocks west of 29 Road, on the south side of Orchard Avenue. The Library entrance is a center door on the west side of the building, marked with a Genealogy Library poster.

Among the aids for genealogists at the Library is the Accelerated Indexing System(AIS), an excellent source on microfisch. It is a compilation of state census indexes, various tax rolls, some military, mortality and other miscellaneous records. It is indexed by surname and then by periods of time. As in all research areas there will be errors, but it is found to be a valuable tool and a time-saver.

Another recommended aid is the Family Registry, a computerized form of family information submitted by you and many, many genealogists. The forms that you submit are placed on microfisch cards in alphabetical surname order for the researcher to read just as you wrote them. Your name and address on the form is the link with others searching your surnames. The Library provides these forms free of charge and sends them to the Salt Lake Library. The microfisch cards in the Branch Libraries are up-dated periodically.

Take time to browse through the books in the reading room. Among many you will find a two-volume set entitled Genealogical and Local History Books in Print, 4th edition, by Netti Schreiner-Yantis. It is a bibliography of more than 30,000 books and microforms with ordering information for each. Volume 2 contains 353 pages, in fine print, of family genealogies, newsletters and biographies. It also lists early diaries and publications about Indian captivity. Worth your time is a 3 volume set entitled Passenger and Immigration Lists Index edited by P. William Filby and Mary K. Myer. It is a guide to published arrival records of about 500,000 passengers who came to the U.S. and Canada in the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries. The information given is (1) name of passenger, (2) passenger's age, if given, (3) place of arrival, (4) year of arrival, (5) code to the source book of information, (6) page number in the source book and (7) names of accompanying passengers, if any, with relationship to the main passenger, their age when given, listed in order as they appear in the original published list. If no age or date is given, it is so indicated.

AT THE LIBRARY

There is a new book on the genealogy shelf at the Public Library, Volume VI of The Compendium of American Genealogy, edited by Frederick Adams Virkus, published by The Institute of American Genealogy in 1937.

This set of books has been called the standard genealogical encyclopedia of the first families of America. The work was founded in 1917 by the editors of Who's Who in America, brought about by the need for information about lineages of large numbers of men and women who were engaged, or wanted to participate, in the war activities. The names, files and data compiled during the war are the foundation upon which it is based. The preceding five volumes were published in 1924, 1926, 1928, 1930 and 1933.

The material is not arranged alphabetically but a good index makes the more than 8,000 lineages in this volume easy to reach. There is also an index of about 2,500 Immigrant Ancestors whose names appear so frequently in the published lineage records that repetition was burdensome.

Volume VI is a much appreciated gift to Mesa County Public Library.

Books

THEY CAME TO POWDERHORN by Loline Sammons. This well-documented history covers the Powderhorn Valley area of Gunnison County. It includes information on the founding, and settlement of the area; early prospectors, miners and mining camps; shootings, duels and rustlers; history of the schools, post offices and communities; early ranches and cattle brands; biographical sketches of the early settlers, etc. It is well worth including in your library.

The cost is \$6.95 per copy, plus \$1.00 postage and handling. It can be ordered from Mrs. Sammons at 7463 County Road 27, Powderhorn, Colorado 81243. (Mrs Sammons is a member of High Country Genealogical Society.)

COLORADO CEMETARY INSCRIPTIONS, compiled by Lela O McQuery contains inscriptions from tombstones in various Colorado cemeteries. With the exception of three cemeteries done ca. 1965, the inscriptions were copied during the early 1950's before so much vandalism had occurred. Consequently, this compilation contains information from many tombstones which no longer exist or have suffered extensive damage. Thirty three counties are represented ranging from a single grave to as many as twelve different cemeteries. over 14,500 names appear in the index.

The book contains 500 pages of information and sells for about \$40.00 but is also available from the American Genealogical Lending Library at a cost of \$11.00 each. Order from: American Genealogical Lending Library, P. O. Box 244, Bountiful, Utah 84010.

Available from the Colorado Genealogical Society is the ARAPAHOE COUNTY MARRIAGE RECORDS INDEX 1859 - 1901. It contains 35000 names from which is now Adams County, Denver County, Denver City, part of Yuma County and part of Washington County. Pre-publication price \$32.50 until April 30, 1986 after which the price will be \$40.00
