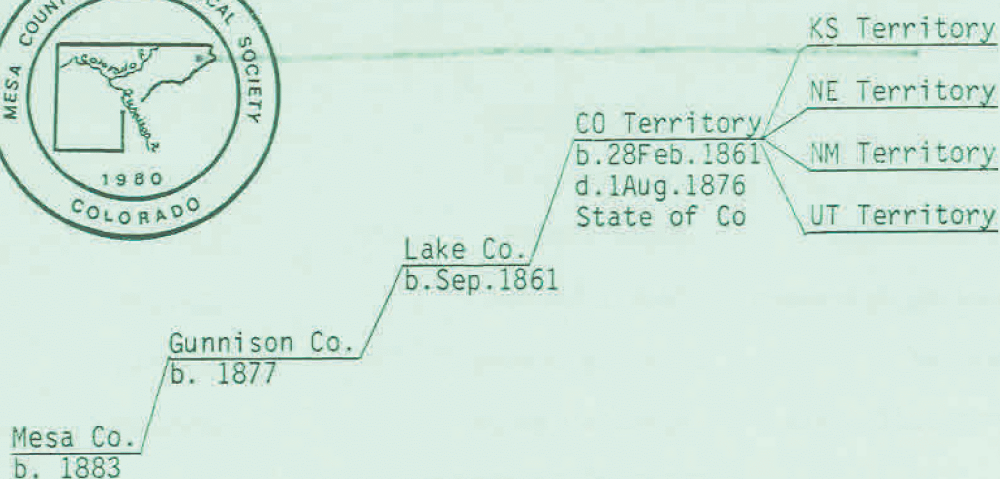
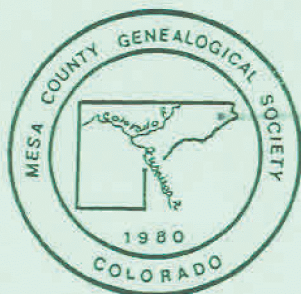

Our program, was each member and guests telling of customs and traditions they observed at Christmas and of special Christmases they remembered. We really got to know some of our members better.

The recipes for our refreshments were brought so everyone could copy them, but it was decided to print them in the Quarterly so everyone could enjoy them. Some of these recipes have been handed down through the different families and some of them are new. Have fun trying something new.

POOR MAN'S CAKE

Recipe from Dorothy Roper's Grandma Walker, dated early 1900's

1 cup lard	1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup coffee	1 tsp. each, cinnamon, cloves & nutmeg
2 cups sugar, either brown or white or one cup of each	
1 lb. (2 cups) raisins, boiled in 2 cups of water til plump	
4 cups flour sifted with 1 tsp. soda and 1/2 tsp. salt and spices	

Pour hot raisin mixture over sugar and lard. Blend (it only takes a moment as hot mixture melts the lard). Add sifted dry ingredients with coffee. Stir in nuts. Bake in large shallow pan or two small ones for 30 or 40 minutes in a moderate oven. The batter is somewhat thinner than usual in cakes. Ice with powdered sugar icing, made with evaporated milk to get a perfect blend of flavors.

FILLED COOKIES

Recipe from Dorothy Inscho's G-Grandmother Elizabeth (Jones) Davis (1842-1923)

FILLING

1/3 cup raisins	1/2 cup dates, cut up
1/2 cup chopped walnuts	1 cup sugar
1 cup water	1 tsp. flour
1 tsp. vanilla	

Mix the above together, bring to boil and cook for 10-15 minutes or until thick. While mixture is cooling - make cookie dough as follows:

COOKIE DOUGH

1 cup sugar	3/4 cup shortening
1 egg	2 tsp. cream tartar
1/2 cup milk	1 tsp. vanilla
3 cups flour - or more (enough to roll out easily)	

Roll very thin - allowing 2 pieces for each cookie. Place lower piece on cookie sheet, add 1/2 tsp. filling - put on top piece and press edges to seal. Bake at 350-360 for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 4 dozen.

Donna Cosby brought the next two recipes

PARTY MINTS

1/2 cup melted butter
1 egg white
2 lbs. powdered sugar, sifted
1/8 tsp. peppermint *(or flavoring of your choice, to taste).
1/3 cup whipping cream, heated
1 tsp. cream of tartar
food coloring as desired

Combine butter and cream, egg white, cream of tartar (add flavoring and food coloring) if all are to be same at this time. *I divided into 5 and added flavor and coloring to each differently.

For ease in handling, chill dough, well covered in frig about 15 minutes. If dough is still sticky work in a little more sugar. The fondant can be molded or used as centers for bon-bons, by using summer coating or chocolate for dipping. (Let stand 30 minutes before dipping).

COCONUT JOYS

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter
3 cups coconut (8 oz.)
2 sq. (2 oz.) un-sweetened chocolate, melted (I like 1 un-sweetened & 1 semi-sweet)
2 cups powdered sugar

Melt butter in sauce pan. Remove from heat. Add powdered sugar and coconut. Mix well

Shape rounded teaspoons into balls. Make indent in center of each and place on cookie sheet. Fill centers of each with melted chocolate. Chill until firm. Store in refrigerator. Makes 3 dozen.

ALMOND BARK COOKIES

Recipe from Gertrude Schaefer

2 lbs. Almond Bark
2 cups dry roasted peanuts
3 cups Rice Krispies or Fruit Loops
1 cup chunky peanut butter
2 cups miniature marshmallows

Melt almond bark (directions on package). Stir in peanut butter. Add rest of ingredients. Drop on waxed paper by teaspoon. After they are set, store in air tight container. Makes 5-6 dozen depending on size. I chop the peanuts.

LUTZ DIP

Recipe from Betty Ann Morse

Layer in serving dish. Refried beans, mashed avacado, taco sauce or salsa, chopped green onions, chopped green chilies, sour cream, grated cheese and top with sliced black olives.

REFRIED BEANS

Pinto beans simmered in water with onions, garlic, bay leaf and a couple of red chilies. Tomatoes are then added and the entire mixture is fried in lard. As the concoction simmers, the beans are fork-mashed and later mashed again and refried in lard. From Readers Digest Sep 1984.

CHEESE TID BITS

Recipe from Carla Nixon

1lb. Old English cheese, grated	1/2 lb. margarine
1 tsp. salt	1/2 tsp. red pepper
2 1/2 cups flour	3/4 to 1 cup finely chopped pecans

Let margarine soften and mix all ingredients well. Roll or form in 1 inch diameter rolls (makes three rolls) and chill in frig 8 hours. Slice thin and bake 10 - 12 minutes at 350 on greased cookie sheet.

CHOCOLATE APPLESAUCE CAKE

Recipe from Donna Roberts Grandmother Alice Brown Manning (1866-1943)

2 cups sugar	1 cup shortening
2 cups un-sweetened applesauce	3 1/2 cups flour
7 tsp. cocoa	1 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. cloves	1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1 cup raisins	
3 1/2 tsp. soda - dissolved in 1 tablespoon hot water	

Cream shortening into sugar. Mix remaining ingredients, put in a greased and floured 9 1/2 x13 inch pan. Bake in a slow oven (325) for approximately 45 minutes.

TARTS (SAND BAKKELS)

Recipe from Edna Anderson

1/2 cup butter	1/2 tsp. almond extract
1/2 cup granulated sugar	1/2 tsp. vanilla
1 small egg, unbeaten	1 1/2 cups all purpose flour

Cream shortening, add sugar and cream well. Add egg and extract. Add the flour to make a stiff dough. Pinch off a small ball of dough. Place it in center of tin and with thumb press dough evenly on inside of sand bakkel tin, spreading it as thin as possible on the bottom of and side of tin. Place filled tins on cookie sheet. Bake in moderate oven (400) for 5-6 minutes or until golden brown. Cool before removing from tins. To remove from tin, invert the tin and pinch slightly. Makes 60-90 tarts.

EVA'S ALMOND FILLING

1/2 cup sugar	1/3 cup butter
2 eggs	
2/3 cup blanched almonds (chopped very fine. If you don't have almonds, substitute 1/2 tsp. almond extract and 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract.)	

Green coloring if desired or any color you choose for an occasion. Work sugar and butter until smooth. Add almonds or flavoring and mix until blended. Fill center of unbaked tart with Almond filling about 2/3 full. Place on cookie sheet and bake 20 minutes at 350. Cool slightly before removing from tins. This recipe is enough for about 90 tiny tarts.

History of Earl (Schwabenland) Land Family

My Mother's maiden name was Dorothea Miller. Her ancestors came from Darmstadt, Germany. They emigrated to Russia in 1766 and settled in the village of Norka, which is on the west bank of the Volga River, called hilly side, south of Saratov.

My grandfather, John Miller was born in 1844 and died in Portland, OR in 1922. His first wife died in childbirth. His second wife bore three children, Henry, John and Kate. She died in 1875. In Jun 1875, he married Anlis Giebelhaus, who had a daughter named Emma. My grandmother bore five children. Her oldest was Adam, then my mother, Dorothea and her twin sister Katie, George and John. My mother was born 29 Aug 1882.

My grandfather left Russia to emigrate to America in 1887. The family arrived at Castle Garden, NY, this was before Ellis Island was established. They travelled to Chicago and on to Sutton, NE by train. Grandfather got to Sutton on 18 Jun 1887. My grandfather and two uncles worked on the railroad. On 23 Mar 1888 Uncle George was born. In Jun 1888, the Miller family moved to Lincoln, NE.

The family first lived in a section house next to the railroad tracks. He then built a two room house on railroad land. The proverb "small but mine" was my grandfather's slogan. My grandfather and uncles continued to work for the railroad and my grandmother and aunts worked at whatever jobs they could get to help support the family.

My grandfather had saved enough money to allow him to travel to Portland, OR on 27 Oct 1890. In the beginning the family lived with friends who had emigrated to the United States from Norka. Then my grandfather rented an empty one room store building as temporary quarters until he could build his own house on the corner of 7th and Morris St. and later built their permanent home on the corner of 7th and Stanton.

My mother and aunt started to school in Portland at the age of 8. They could not speak any English and the other students in their class ridiculed and picked on them and made fun of them because of this. The twins had to learn English as quickly as possible to avoid embarrassment. They also taught their two younger brothers to speak English. It was necessary for my grandmother to find work in the homes of American families. My uncles, George and John were too young to be left at home alone. They devised a plan so my mother would go to school and my aunt would babysit her brothers. The next day my aunt would go to school and my mother would stay home. Being identical twins, the teachers thought it was the same person attending school. This went on for several years. When they were in the third grade, the teacher asked my grandmother if one of the twins had died because she had remembered seeing two little girls in the first grade. She said "No, that both were attending school". The teacher reported this to the principal, who called my mother to his office and asked her what her name was. She said "Dora". Because they were doing so well he let them continue in school with the name of Katie. This went on until the end of the fifth grade, when my mother quit school to go to work.

My Father was born 11 Nov 1871 to Friedrich and Maria Christina Kinsel Schwabenland, in the village of Straub, Russia which is on the east bank of the Volga River, called meadowland. His ancestors lived in the Province of Schwabenland, Germany, near Stuttgart. The name is derived from an ancient Teutonic Tribe-the Svevi or Sweben. They settled in southwestern Germany and in the seventh century this area was called Schwabenland. His ancestors left

Germany in 1766 to emigrate to Russia. My father left Russia on 15 Nov 1891 to come to America. He boarded the steamship S S Ems in Bremen, Germany 10 Dec and arrived at Castle Garden, NY 23 Dec 1891

The night of 23 Dec was spent at Ellis Island and the next morning he boarded a train for Fresno, CA and arrived there 29 Dec 1891. From 1 Apr 1892 to 1 Mar 1893 he worked for the Southern Pacific Railroad earning \$1.75 for an eleven hour day. He saved enough money to pay back the \$100.00 he borrowed for his passage and \$70.00 to his parents in Russia.

On 1 Apr 1893 he travelled to Crete, NE to attend an academy for Ministerial students with \$25.00 in his pockets. However, during the summer months he taught German to about 20 American children and earned enough to go a year to school.

His parents and brothers and sisters left Russia Oct 1893, arriving at Baltimore, MD 10 Nov 1893 on the S S Neckar steamship, arriving in Fresno, CA 20 Nov 1893.

From 1893 to 1895 my father attended school at Crete, NE. After graduating he attended the Chicago Theological Seminary for the next three years and graduated 11 May 1898 just six years and four months after he arrived in the United States.

In the summer of 1898 my father left Chicago for Glen Ullin, ND to work with German speaking immigrants. On 21 Aug 1898 he was ordained a minister of the German Congregational Church. He remained in ND for two years organizing churches in surrounding towns to Glen Ullin. In the summer of 1900 he left ND to accept the ministry in Portland, OR.

My mother married my father, Rev. John Conrad Schwabenland, 27 May 1903 at her parents residence in Portland, OR. My father took his bride to Odessa, WA where he was pastor of the German Congregational Church. My oldest brother, Ray was born there 26 Sep 1904. My oldest sister, Emma was born in Beaverton, OR, which is just west of Portland 16 Feb 1907. My brother, Walter was born in Warden, WA, where my father was pastor of the church, 14 Mar 1909. The family moved back to Portland in 1909 when my father accepted the position as General Missionary of the Pacific coast states. In 1910 my parents bought the house which was located on the corner of 7th and Skidmore, which my grandfather built.

My oldest brother started school in 1910. He couldn't speak any English because my father insisted that German be spoken at home. My brother came home from school crying saying he was picked on and made fun of because he couldn't speak English. This had happened to my mother twenty years before. She said "from now on, English will be spoken in this house", so when I started to school in 1920, I didn't have this problem because I couldn't speak German. Another sister was born in the Portland house on 6 Jan 1912. My father then accepted the position as General Missionary in Denver, CO. I was born in Globeville, which is now Denver in a house that was located under the intersection of I-25 and I-70, on 22 Jun 1914. Naturally the house no longer exists.

The family moved to Sanger, CA in Dec 1914. Then my father had churches in Lodi, Dinuba and Biola, CA. My Grandmother Miller died 28 Jan 1919 of pneumonia. The family moved back to Portland, OR in the fall of 1921. My youngest sister, Ann was born 9 Jun 1922 at the family home. My Grandfather died on 29 Jan 1922 after being hit by a car.

In 1923 my father accepted the pastorship of the Windsor, CO German Congregational Church and in 1926 the Berthoud Congregational Church.

I graduated from Berthoud High School in May 1933.

My parents moved back to Oregon in Mar 1933 then in 1934 they moved back to Odessa, WA where he served as pastor until 1939, at which time he retired from the Ministry after serving forty one years.

CHRISTMAS CINNAMON CAKE

Recipe from Sue Martinez

1 box yellow cake mix
3/4 cup oil

1 box instant vanilla pudding
3/4 cup water

Beat four eggs into mixture, one at a time, add 1 tsp. butter flavoring, 1 tsp. vanilla. Beat 8 minutes. Put 1/3 mixture in greased angel food cake pan. Mix 1/2 cup sugar and 2 tsp. cinnamon. Sprinkle 1/3 over batter, then another 1/3 batter, then sugar mixture until all is used. Bake 45 minutes at 350, let set in pan 5 minutes. Glaze.
