

Just think what a great collection this would be if every person who had a Civil War ancestor sent a picture. Who knows, maybe that long lost picture of great, great grandpa just might turn up.

PHOTOS WANTED

The Department of the Army, U. S. Army Military History Institute, Carlisle Barracks, PA 17013-5008 has an on-going project. They would like to collect a photograph of every Civil War soldier, both North and South — all 4 million of them! So far they have about 80,000. If you wish to contribute to the collection, you may send either the original photo, insured, or a good negative made by copying the original. They do not want to copy from copy prints because it is difficult to get a good sharp negative. Your original, along with an 8x10 enlargement, will be returned to the donor by insured mail.

If additional copies are desired, up to three prints may be made from one negative. The museum has an extensive photographic collection and will check its card file and regiments lists for inquiries if an SASE is enclosed. They also are collection correspondence from Civil War period, i.e. soldier's letters, diaries and memoirs. This info from Michael J. Winey, Curator. from the Davis County IA Gen. Soc.
