

The following changes to the By-Laws were proposed at the January 1993 meeting and the general membership approved these changes at the February 1993 meeting.

Article VIII - Board of Directors Section C - Meeting

Currently reads:

Meetings shall be held no later than one week prior to the general membership meeting.

Approved change:

Meetings shall be held in February, May, August, and November, no later than one week prior to the general membership meeting, unless deem necessary.

ARTICLE IX - Dissolution of Society

Currently reads:

In the event of the dissolution of this organization, all saleable assets shall be converted to cash. The monies of the Society shall be used to purchase genealogical materials for local libraries and other education institutions that qualify, at that time as an exempt organization under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. ### TOWNS IN MESA COUNTY

### CLIFTON

Clifton, named for its nearness to the Bookcliffs, was apparently assigned that name by railroad survey crews as early as 1882, but the railroad did not arrive from the east until 1890.

It was not until 1900 that the name appeared in conjunction with a post office and general store; Judge A. G. Mann was postmaster. In 1902 the Fruit Growers Association built a packing shed near the siding because there were enough orchards in the area for the railroad to provide a freight stop. The townsite was platted in 1905, it has not yet been incorporated.

There were 10,000 acres in fruit in the first decades of the century, with Cross Orchards the largest operation in that area. However, coddling moth infestation and seepage destroyed apple and pear orchards in the 1920's. Orchards were later replanted. Apples and pears continue to be the important revenue producers, but cherries have also been grown extensively as a cash crop. Many orchards have disappeared during the past two decades, as the area has been heavily subdivided for residential development.

Fruitvale, west of Clifton, was a community centered around its schools, including a senior high. A fruit loading platform and packing shed near 30 and E Roads employed local residents near harvest. The Ancient Order of Fools, a community club begun during the 1930s Depression, helped people over the hard times with laughter.

The Clifton Rural Fire Protection District organized in 1943, replacing the earlier Clifton Fire Department. The District built a new fire station in 1979, it also has a volunteer Rescue Squad, a feature of many Mesa County Towns.

### CAMEO

Cameo is named for a stone face formation in a cliff overlooking the area. Originally a coal mining town, it was founded in 1907 when John McNeil of Grand Junction Fuel and Mining Company opened the mine. Longtime county residents recall the "horrible, dangerous suspension bridge" that linked Cameo to the highway.

Cameo also served as headquarters for the men building the roller dam for the Highline Canal in 1912. In 1957 Public Service of Colorado opened a new steam generating plant at Cameo. The 6.5 million dollar plant is a 44,000-kilowatt unit doubling area capacity.

### BRIDGEPORT

Bridgeport, first known as Arlington, is located some 20 miles southeast of Grand Junction on the Mesa-Delta County line. It was initially a stop on the Gunnison Division of the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad, and later the site of a 370-acre apple orchard, one of the most extensive in Mesa County, established in the 1890's by Fred and Avery Burford. The orchard was bought by John Moore in 1903, and acquired by his son Frank and cousin George Emerson around 1926. The orchard was then replanted to peaches. It was later acquired by the Biggs-Kurtz interests when it was traded for a cattle ranch.

In 1964 Bridgeport became part of the Musser family holdings which include much of adjacent Dominguez Canyon. The one-lane Bridgeport bridge currently provides the most accessible entrance to the highly popular and scenic Dominguez Canyon Wildness Study Area, managed by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

### WHITEWATER

Settlers arrived in Whitewater in 1881. In the early 1880's Whitewater was reported to be larger than Grand Junction, boasting a hotel, blacksmith shop, railroad and telegraph station, two eating places, stores, a dance hall, stockyards, and a ferry across the Gunnison River. The post office, established in October 1884, was in various homes and stores until the present building was constructed in 1963-64. For many years, it was in the Mahannah store, owned by G.W. Peugh after 1924.

Carolyn Edwards homesteaded where the town is now situated. She subdivided her land and donated lots with the provision the town remain "dry". About 1905, one man decided to challenge this and set up a saloon without taking into account the women of Whitewater. They gathered and descended upon his place of business, but, fortunately, he was not there. They broke up his stock and let it be known that tar and feathers awaited him if he returned.

A. Mr. Guston reportedly built the hotel, which Eli Mahannah later purchased in 1884. The telephone switchboard was later located in Mahannah's hotel, and the young women who managed it lived in a room next to the switchboard so they could answer anytime someone rang.

Ranching was the major industry. Cattlemen began ranches as headquarters and bases for wintering cows. Whitewater once had large stockyards and Unaweep ranchers ferried cattle across the often dangerous Gunnison River.

Orchards were prominent for a short time with those of R. W. Shropshire, J.R. Penniston, and William H. Coffman especially well known. Some of the first prizes won by Mesa County orchardists were awarded to fruit grown in Whitewater orchards. Eventually, the trees were lost to poor ground and alkali seepage.

### NORWEGIAN RESEARCH

The Vesterheim Genealogical Center is a division of Verterheim, the Norwegian-American Museum in Decorah, Iowa. A staff of six, including Gerhard Naeseth and associate director Hedberg search library and archive collections, serving as a clearing house for "solution of problems", channel inquiries between Norway and the United States, compile bibliographies, collect family histories and assemble records. Vesterheim does not "do" family histories, but it provides help, for a fee. A user must be a member of the Verterhiem museum and the Vesterheim center, for \$16 total, and record searches can cost \$8 an hour or more. Letters with membership questions should be sent to the Norwegian-American Museum, 502 W. Water St. Decorah, Iowa. Genealogical letters can be sent to the VGS, 415 W. Main St. Madison Wis 53703. Naeseth said the center is always on the lookout for copies of Norwegian immigrant family histories or related publications.
